

LUAAPS JANUARY NEWSLETTER



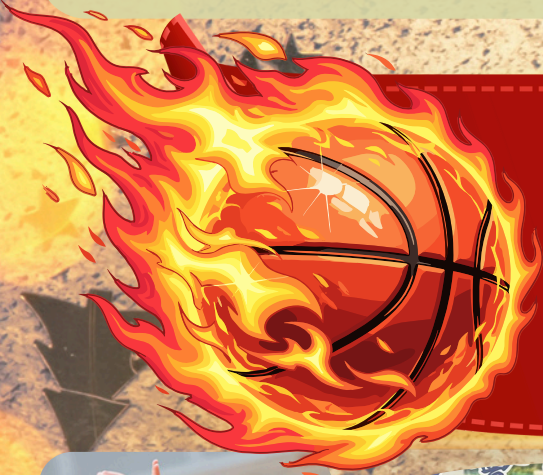
