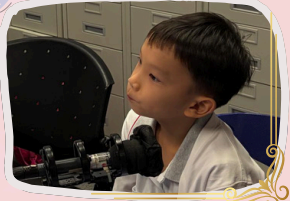
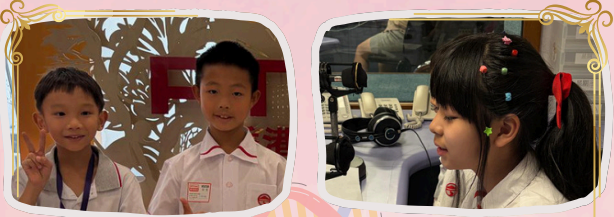




The Right Frequency

Little Starfish

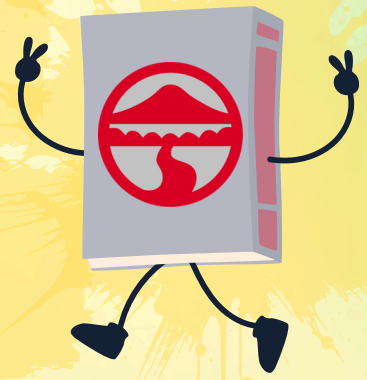

Showcasing Character



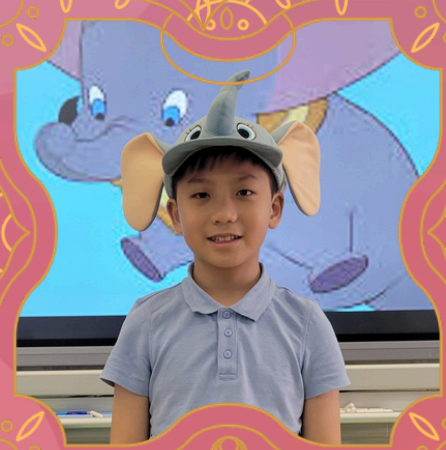

Character Day was not only a fun celebration, but also a meaningful reminder of how books spark imagination, build empathy, and connect us through shared stories.





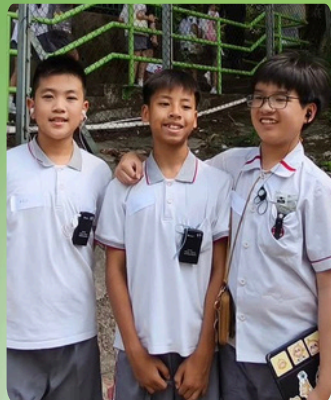
Dragon Boating
